In May 2018, Millie, wearing Chelsea colours, lifted the Women's FA Cup as they beat Arsenal in front of a crowd of 45,423 at Wembley.

Millie's most recent appearance for England was on 8th June where England beat Russia 3-1 in a World Cup qualifier to move back to the top of the table.

Millie, who previously worked at Killamarsh Sports Centre, has always been interested in sport and is an inspiration to the young people of Killamarsh.

Millie will officially open the newly re-furbished upper gym, a state-of-the -art functional fitness suite, at Killamarsh Sports Centre, in July 2018.

BIRCHLANDS PARK PROJECT

The Parish Council has been working with partners, such as residents, other Councils and community groups, to secure funding from Derbyshire County Council for an important project in Killamarsh. To be allocated funding the project has to include voluntary and community action and offer scope for future development. The Project Working Group, after wide research and consultation, recommended the development of a 'play and recreation environment created using natural and recycled materials'. This idea was met with much enthusiasm at the recent consultation event held at the Leisure Centre and will be known as the 'Birchlands Park Project'.

There is significant evidence to support the health, wellbeing and community benefits of such a project, as well as providing value for money and sustainability. Most importantly, there is opportunity for whole community involvement.

KILLAMARSH LITTER AWARENESS PROJECT

The Parish Council has been working with local schools, volunteer and community groups and North East District Council to find ways to tackle the litter problem that is blighting our lovely village and surrounding areas.

The best efforts of the Parish Council, NEDCC and the County Council can only have a limited impact on the reduction of litter in our village. To make any significant difference we must all take responsibility to clean up our village and to ensure we, and our children, understand the harmful effects of litter on wellbeing, wildlife, the environment and on parish finances.



NEDDC recycling officers recently visited schools as part of the litter awareness programme, where they educate children in the importance of

recycling household rubbish. Primary schools have been actively engaged in this programme over the last year, supported by a grant from DCC.

Participating children were asked to spread the 'Keep Killamarsh Clean' message and their work will be on display in the Leisure Centre from 16th July 2018. Prizes will be awarded to individual children and to schools for most exciting and successful suggestions for encouraging people to bin their litter or, better still, take it home.

Let's work together to ensure our village is clean, tidy and free from rubbish!

18 months to 4 years - Wednesdays from 11am


- Themed sessions, involving music, stories and games make the class interesting and fun.
