Money also raised from the raffle at the event for the Derbyshire Cancer Buddies scheme came to a worthy sum of £330. The project provides online group and confidential 1-1 telephone support to community members who are diagnosed with, and/or affected by cancer, from volunteers who have experienced similar cancer challenges.

Tracey stated that "the Travellers Rest will continue to be a place where the Killamarsh Poppies Group can produce their poppies to make further contributions to Remembrance Day next year."


