A highlight of the Jubilee celebrations was seeing the activities that all our local schools and nurseries were engaging in, and presenting them with our commemorative Jubilee bookmarks

which were gratefully received and will hopefully aid our young readers. I was very impressed with the efforts that many children had gone to learning about the monarchy and seeing the colourful displays and activities they had engaged in.

Across the summer period it was also pleasing to see our younger parishioners engaging in outdoor activities with the Extreme Wheels team. Youngsters took part in either scooting or BMXing at the Skate Park or Body Zorbing on the Sports Field, engaging in healthy outdoor exercise on a weekly Wednesday night.

The Sports Centre redevelopment is nearly there, with expected completion due later in September. The CLOC building also remains available for hire while we review long term future use of the building. The Council have also recently agreed to the placement of four defibrillator units across the community over the coming months.

Killamarsh Skate Park to be Refurbished

Following a successful bid by North East Derbyshire District Council, £420k of grant funding has been obtained to address issues across areas of North East Derbyshire that suffer from anti-social behaviour. Killamarsh is one of the lucky beneficiaries of a significant proportion of funding, which is earmarked to refurbish the Skate Park in the village and contribute towards extreme and urban activities. Cllr. Clough commented "The additional investment in updating the skate park is much welcomed. It will go a long way to providing our young people in the village with improved outdoor facilities and activities, adding to the big investment already made in the nearby Sports Centre."



More Benches in the Village

Additional benches have been installed in the village to replace both damaged seating and to add to

availability.

The first is a new bench at Norwood Park as there was previously no seating available around the play area.



The third new bench is at Westthorpe Green set at the back of the grassed area with trees opposite the West End pub.



The two steel benches that were situated in the Sports Centre car park have been moved to memorial gardens due to the pending car park

The second new bench is

reconfiguration and risk of damage or loss. The memorial plaque that accompanied the benches has been cleaned and resecured between the benches at memorial gardens to preserve the memory of Colin Robinson, former Parish Councillor and founder of Killamarsh Community Trust Association.

A further bench is to be fitted at Birch Park, but is subject to approval from NEDDC so we are awaiting permission to fit the new equipment.

Speed Indicator Devices Update

As we mentioned in the last newsletter, the council is looking to source Speed Indicator Device signs (SIDS) to place at known risk locations around Killamarsh. A bid for funding was submitted through the Derbyshire Police & Crime Commissioner grants scheme, and we are pleased to announce that we won a bid for £6,760

towards the equipment. We are now in the process of procuring the equipment and going through the relevant processes for placement in the village.

The parish council have been successful in their application to the Woodland Trust for some free tree saplings, also as part of the Queen's Green Canopy! Therefore we are launching a big 'Tree Giveaway' for residents in Killamarsh.

Winter Grit for the Elderly & Vulnerable of Killamarsh

Planning ahead for winter, Killamarsh Parish Council are still making available bags of grit salt to elderly and vulnerable parishioners as winter heads our way from November onwards.

Thanks to the Killamarsh Wombles

Thanks go out to all the Killamarsh Wombles for all their efforts over the past year.

The Killamarsh Wombles were founded in February 2021 and have cleared vast quantities of litter, fly-tipping and years worth of embedded plastics etc. from canal beds in the area. This year, the group have seen at least 50% to 75% more wild plants and flowers grow in what were patchy/barren areas. They pick litter nearly every day and get together as a group at least 3 times a week to make sure that Killamarsh doesn't return to what it once was. Additionally, one of the members has been dedicated to ensuring that drains have been (and continue to be) cleared by NEDDC and have also had more bins added around the village. The Wombles aim to give more to our village this year and will continue with their mission, whilst growing in number. If anyone wishes to join in, feel free to contact Mary-Ann for a chat.
